

Dan's January Newsletter

Greetings Neighbor,

I want to wish everyone a happy New Years! Going into this year is bittersweet for me as this will be my last year on the Oakland City Council. For the past 11 years it has been an honor to serve the people of District 1 and our entire city.

During that time, I have passed legislation to improve public safety by banning ghost guns and the parts that make them, worked with a coalition to create the Oakland Police Commission, prioritized funding for investigations of serious and violent crimes, and more. I have fought for affordable housing and tenant rights by authoring the Tenant Protection Ordinance, and creating below market rate housing by earmarking tens of millions of dollars to Oakland's Affordable Housing Trust Fund. I've worked tirelessness to protect our environment and take local action on climate by leading efforts to ban the storage and handling of coal in Oakland, passing a law requiring new buildings to be build green and all-electric, and authored the reusable foodware ordinance this last year that reduces litter and bans plastic food ware.

There are many more policies that I am proud of in Oakland, but I also understand that there is still more to do. 2023 was a challenging year in Oakland, especially as it relates to public safety. In September, my colleagues on the Council passed a <u>public safety resolution</u> that I wrote calling for fixes (including a dispatcher retention plan) to our 911 system, moves forward a possible lateral police academy, authorizes security cameras on on-ramps and a grant program for retail businesses to acquire cameras, facilitates additional FBI investigators to assist OPD, requires the creation of a permanent walking beat officer plan along with a plan for neighborhood ambassadors, and more to address our safety challenges. This next year I will look at additional pieces of legislation that can help us address the issues of violent crime and the high volume of property crime we see in our city. Thank you to my staff and my colleagues on the Council for their hard work and collaboration. Best.

In Memory of Officer Tuang Le

Before the new year, we learned of the death of Oakland Police Officer Tuan Le killed in the line of duty responding to a burglary in the 400 block of Embarcadero. I offer my deepest condolences and heartfelt sympathies to the family, close friends, and hundreds of fellow OPD colleagues of the officer who tragically had his life taken away last week.

The death of a police officer is a profound loss, not only to their immediate community, but to Oakland as a whole. In the face of danger and adversity, these officers courageously put themselves on the front lines to protect and serve, embodying the values of duty and sacrifice. In this difficult time, may the memories of his service and the support of the community provide some solace to those who are grieving this tragic loss. My staff and I express our gratitude for the officer's unwavering commitment to the principles of justice and service, and offer our deep condolences to all who are affected by this loss. As with any senseless loss of life within our city, OPD is investigating. This week, we learned OPD has made arrests in this case.

We need your help in the following ways:




