Youth Employment Partnership (YEP) Summer Program

It's summertime and Team Oakland is back!

Since 1993, Team Oakland has offered summer traineeships to over 2,600 Oakland youth and young adults. Team members get practical experience by participating in city cleanups, park maintenance, habitat restoration and community outreach. They also benefit from trainings on work skills, life skills, and environmental topics. The summer program is a collaboration between Oakland Public Works and the Youth Employment Partnership (YEP); it kicked off earlier this month, and youth participants have collected over 1,000 bags of trash per week. City of Oakland begins Universal Basic Mobility Pilot Project

The City of Oakland has begun distributing debit cards loaded with up to \$160 to low-income West Oakland residents or workers as part of the <u>West Oakland</u> <u>Universal Basic Mobility Pilot</u>. Eligible participants must live or work in West Oakland earn less than the "area median income" of \$103,500 annually for a single person and up to \$192,250 for an eight-person household (full income limits available <u>here</u>). Funded by "<u>West Oakland Transit Investments (WOTI)</u>" grant from the Alameda County Transportation Commission, this project continues the transformation of public transit in Oakland. Zum Launches Nation's First 100% Electric School Bus Fleet in Oakland

Zūm, the modern student transportation platform, announced on May 15th that Oakland Unified School District (OUSD) will be the first major school district in the U.S. to transition to a 100% electrified school bus system with groundbreaking vehicle-to-grid technology. Zum is providing a fleet of 74 electric school buses and bidirectional chargers in Oakland, managed through its AI-enabled technology platform. The all-EV fleet will not only transport students sustainably, but also play a critical dual role as a Virtual Power Plant (VPP), giving 2.1 gigawatt hours of energy back to the power grid at scale annually. StopWaste Environmental Leadership Winners

Congratulations to the StopWaste Environmental Leadership Awards winners: <u>Sparkl Reusables</u> and <u>oWOW</u>, representing Oakland! Sparkl Reusables, in partnership with Spectrum Community Services in Hayward, was recognized for their Excellence in Reusable Foodware Partnership. They switched from disposable to reusable containers for over 400 senior meals served daily at locations throughout Alameda County, preventing some 10,000 pieces of single-use foodware each month. OWOW won the Excellence in Construction Innovation award for their forward-thinking construction methods. By using responsibly sourced mass timber, prefabricating building elements, and integrating development, design, and construction, they minimize waste and have the potential to build twice as fast and reduce cost by 30% compared to conventional construction.

Celebrated for the 22nd time, StopWaste's annual awards program honors Alameda County entities for their leadership and innovations in advancing environmental sustainability, waste prevention, and contributions to building healthy, climateresilient communities in Alameda County.
