On Saturday, September 17, the City of Oakland will be hosting Creek to Bay Day! 2022 marks the 27th anniversary of Oakland Creek to Bay Day, held in conjunction with California and International Coastal Cleanup Day, one of the largest organized volunteer days in California, the nation, and 100 other participating countries.

Individuals and households can be a part of this 27th anniversary event by pitching

in to clean up coastal areas across the city, as well as pledging and committing to actions from our homes to protect watersheds.

Lake Merritt Algae Bloom Update

You may have read about, or seen first-hand, the <u>algae bloom and fish die-off at</u>
<u>Lake Merritt</u>. You can find more info on the <u>City website</u>, but here are a few updates:

Why is it happening? While no official cause has been determined, some experts posit that the fish die-off—which has also been seen in Foster City, the Alameda estuary, Keller Beach, Sausalito, and Fort Baker—is due to a harmful red algae bloom that has also been seen around the Bay. This type of bloom lowers the amount of oxygen in the water, which fish cannot survive.

What is the City doing? Oakland Public Works has contracted cleanup crews who removed 1200 lbs of dead fish. OPW is working with agencies like the California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, to identify appropriate options to treat the area.

What can I do? Those who want to lend a hand and learn more about the health of the Lake should check out the Lake Merritt Institute or Rotary Nature Center Friends, two grassroots stewardship organizations.




Oakland To Return 5-Acre Section of Joaquin Miller Park to Sogorea Te' Land Trust

In one of the first cases of a municipality returning land to Native peoples, under the proposed "cultural conservation easement," Oakland would retain ownership of the designated area, but the <u>Sogorea Te' Land Trust</u> would have nearly full control over the use of the land, for cultural, environmental, and educational uses, in perpetuity.

The plan to return the Joaquin Miller site has been in the works since 2018, when Mayor Libby Schaaf first met with Gould after watching the documentary "Beyond Recognition." Schaaf asked Gould if she saw opportunities for giving land back in Oakland. Sogorea Te' members searched for a culturally significant location and zeroed in on Sequoia Point off Skyline Boulevard, which features a flat, paved overlook with an expansive view of the city and bay, as well as a thick grove of trees. The area will continue to be open to the public and plans for the site include hosting seasonal ceremonies, replacing invasive plant species with native ones, and opening an educational center.

Southwest Airlines Brings Sustainable Aviation Fuel to Oakland Airport

This month marks the first time that sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) will be used in the operations of Southwest Airlines® at Oakland International Airport (OAK). This introduction makes OAK the third commercial airport in the United States to have SAF incorporated into the daily operations of a major U.S. airline. This initiative is a part of Southwest's **goal** to replace 10% of its total jet fuel consumption with SAF by 2030, which is an important step toward its long-term goal to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050. The SAF that will be used at Southwest's OAK operation is provided by Neste and is made from renewable and sustainably sourced waste and residue materials, like used cooking oil or animal waste fat. Adding Neste's SAF to Southwest's operation is a seamless process—after blending with conventional jet fuel in accordance with applicable industry standards, it is compatible with both Southwest's existing aircraft as well as the airport's current infrastructure. EV Charger Technical Assistance for Multifamily Buildings in West Oakland

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District and Stopwaste are partnering with local electrical contractor Energy Conservation Options (ECO) to provide no-cost electric vehicle (EV) charging station assessments for apartment buildings in West Oakland and Richmond. The free assessment includes an onsite technical assessment and follow up report detailing project scope, cost, and available incentives. A subset of assessed buildings will receive additional assistance in applying for incentive programs and securing permits and installation contracts. EBCE EV Charging Infrastructure Rebates

East Bay Community Energy, Alameda County's public power provider, is pleased to announce a partnership with the California Energy Commission's Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP). Businesses, commercial and multifamily housing properties, and public agency facilities in Alameda County can apply for rebates up to \$80,000 on eligible electric vehicle charger equipment and installation costs.


Lincoln Square Park's Climate Resilience Plan

Lincoln Square Park has plans to become a resiliency hub for the community of Chinatown. In the coming years, the park will rebuild their recreation center to be environmentally friendly, and to include resources for the neighborhood during climate events, wildfires, and days with poor air quality. It is amazing to see the vision of this project that is by the community, for the community, and we can't wait to see the innovations of Lincoln Square Park!



The City of Oakland wants to hear your thoughts and perceptions on building electrification and how we can better facilitate the transition to 100% clean electricity in all buildings. Complete this **5-minute survey** here, also available in Chinese and Spanish.

Also, UC Berkeley researchers are looking for diverse homeowners and renters living in Oakland to participate in a study on household electrification. You'll receive \$50 for your time. Participating in the study involves a 30-45-minute interview inperson, preferably in your home (following local health guidelines for COVID-19) or in a video call. Researchers will address your concerns about the reliability and affordability of clean energy, and ask about your views related to any changes you have made or plan to make (or not!) in your electricity and gas consumption (e.g. purchasing back-up generators, changing from gas to electric heating, installing solar panels). EBCE Resilient Home Program

With <u>Resilient Home</u>, EBCE has done the upfront legwork to select an experienced partner, Sunrun, and pre-negotiated solar and battery backup system incentives for Oakland homeowners. To further lower customer costs, Sunrun will pay homeowners \$1,250 after installation for agreeing to share their stored energy with EBCE when demand on the power grid is high. This will help the grid operate more reliably, and cut carbon emissions and costs for all EBCE customers.
